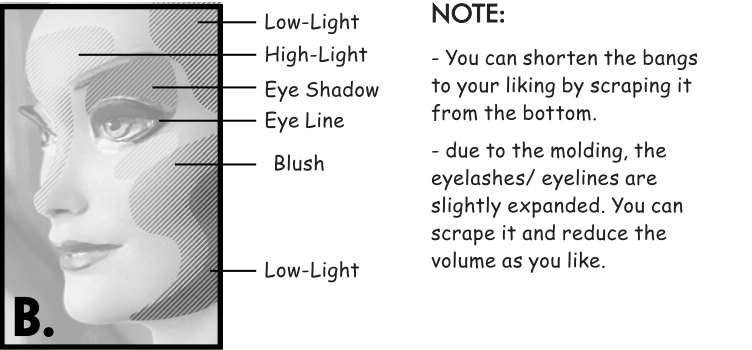
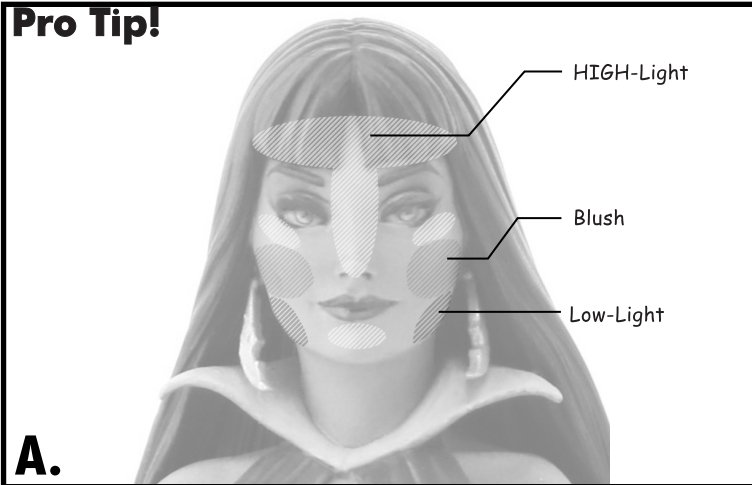

Vampirella debuted in 1969 in a black & white magazine titled simply VAMPIRELLA. With a stunning cover by the legendary artist, Frank Frazetta. Vampirella #1 quickly made publishing history with its depiction of a vampire heroine, and its success prompted comics giants DC and Marvel to launch horror titles of their own. Vampirella appeared in this magazine format throughout the 1970's. Many of these classic stories were illustrated by the legendary artist Jose Gonzalez and have remained quite popular with comics fans to the present day.

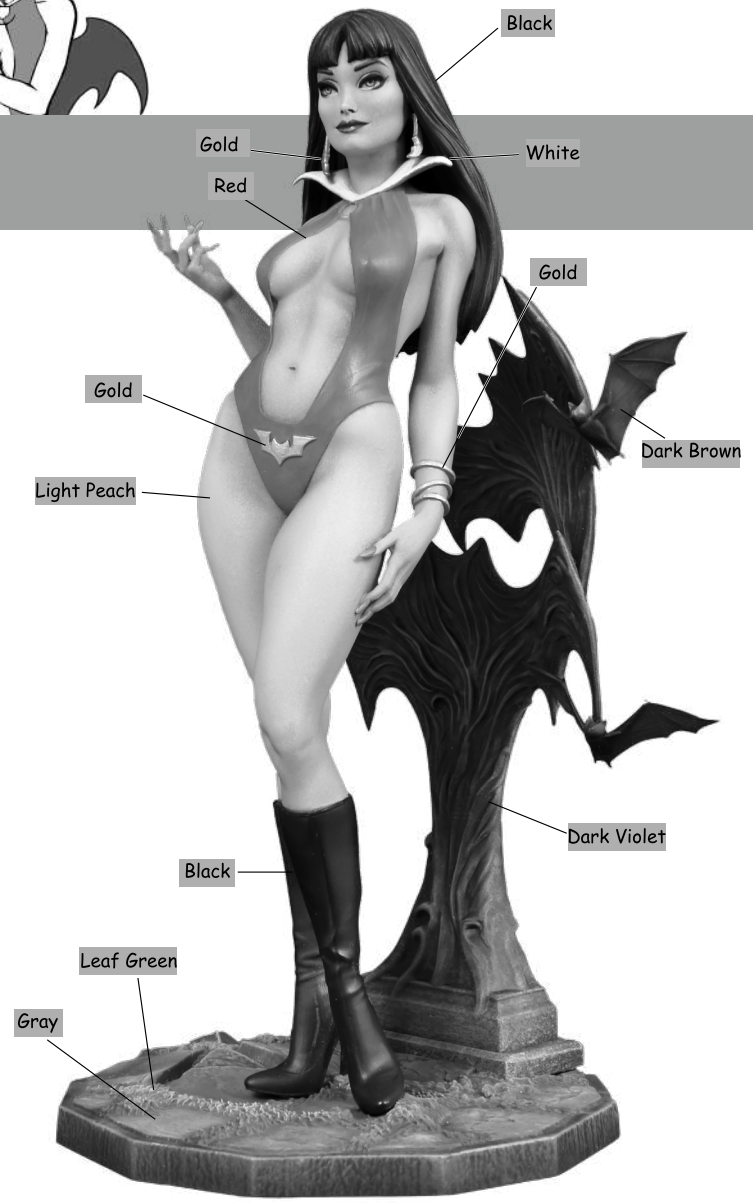
After a brief publishing hiatus, Vampirella returned in 1992 and quickly regained her reigning status as the queen of all female comics characters! In continuous publication since her early 90s comeback, Vampirella has been written by top talents including Alan Moore, Mark Millar, Grant Morrison, James Robinson, Jeph Loeb, Warren Ellis, and illustrated by fan favorite artists such as Joe Quesada, J. Scott Campbell, Michael Turner, Jae Lee, Adam Hughes, Mark Texeira, Joe Jusko, Arthur Suydam, and many more! A Vampirella feature film premiered on Showtime Networks in 1996, and the character continues to appear on numerous items of licensed merchandise.

In 2010, Dynamite Entertainment acquired Vampirella and has published both original and classic material!



NOTE:

- You can shorten the bangs to your liking by scraping it from the bottom.
- due to the molding, the eyelashes/ eyelines are slightly expanded. You can scrape it and reduce the volume as you like.

IMPORTANT - READ THIS FIRST!

- This model needs to be assembled. Please read the instructions carefully before assembling the model.
- After removing the product from the plastic bag, tear the plastic bag and dispose of it in a safe place, as there is a danger of suffocation if young children mishandle it.
- Carefully remove the parts from the trees and discard the trees after removing all parts.
- Due to the manufacturing process ,sharp points may be present that could cause harm. Do not play with or mishandle the trees, and do not use them for anything other than their intended purpose. Households with young children should be particularly cautious.
- Use nippers to remove parts, and smooth any burrs remaining on parts with a craft knife or file. Exercise caution when using nippers, craft knives, or files, as they can cause cuts to hands or fingers. Children under 10 years old should have a parent or guardian carry out the work.
- This kit contains small parts that pose a choking hazard, so keep them out of reach of young children. Never leave a child younger than the target age unsupervised, as there is a risk of swallowing these parts.
- If using plastic cement or paint, pay close attention to the following points: In case of contact with eyes, immediately seek medical attention and follow safety instructions on the product packaging. Do not use cement or paint in enclosed areas due to the risk of inhaling toxic fumes. Never use cement or paint near an open flame, as it poses a fire hazard.

PLEASE TEST FIT PARTS BEFORE GLUING TO ENSURE PROPER FIT.

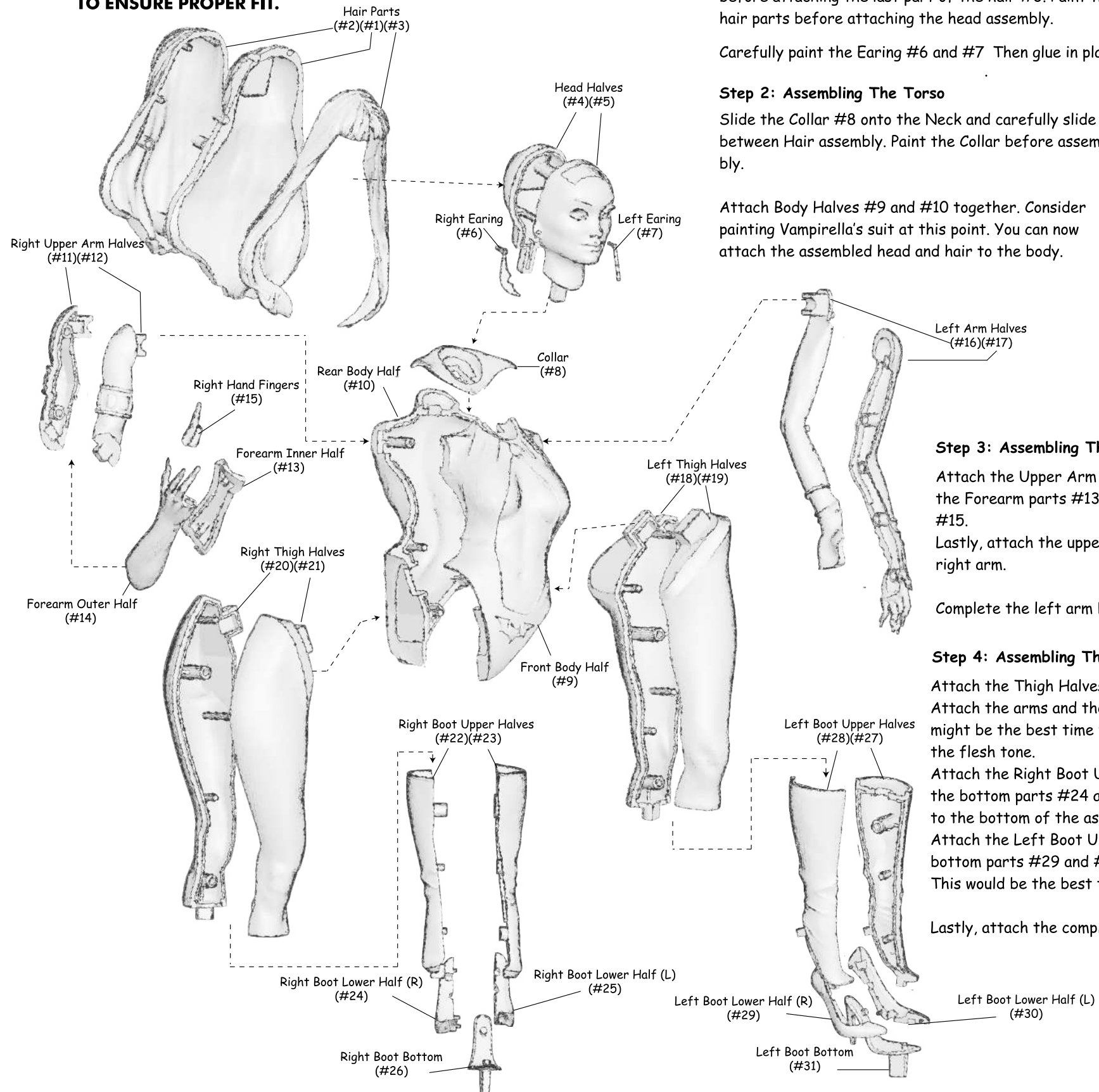

Step 1: Assembling The Head

Attach part #4 to #5. You may want to paint the face at this point.

Attach part #1 and #2. Then place the assembled head before attaching the last part of the hair #3. Paint the hair parts before attaching the head assembly.

Carefully paint the Earing #6 and #7 Then glue in place

Step 2: Assembling The Torso

Slide the Collar #8 onto the Neck and carefully slide between Hair assembly. Paint the Collar before assembly.

Attach Body Halves #9 and #10 together. Consider painting Vampirella's suit at this point. You can now attach the assembled head and hair to the body.

Step 3: Assembling The Arms

Attach the Upper Arm Halves #11 and #12. Now, assemble the Forearm parts #13 and #14. Then plug in the Fingers #15. Lastly, attach the upper arm to the forearm to complete the right arm.

Complete the left arm by attaching #16 and #17

Step 4: Assembling The Legs and completing the body

Attach the Thigh Halves #18 and #19. Then #20 and #21. Attach the arms and the thighs to the completed torso. This might be the best time to add any putty if preferred and paint the flesh tone.

Attach the Right Boot Upper Halves #22 and #23. Then add the bottom parts #24 and #25. Then finish by attaching #26 to the bottom of the assembled boot. Attach the Left Boot Upper Halves #27 and #28. Then add the bottom parts #29 and #30. Finish by adding #31 to the bottom. This would be the best time to paint the boots.

Lastly, attach the completed boots to the finished body.

Step 5: Assembling The Bat Shadows

Attach Bat (1) #S4 to the Bat Shadow Bottom Part #S1. Attach Bat (2) #S5 to the Bat Shadow Top Part #S3. Then, attach the Top Shadow part to the bottom part and assemble them on the Shadow Base #S2.

Note: Parts #35, #36 and #37 are not used in this assembly.

Final Step: Completion

Lastly, place the finished shadows assembly and the completed figure in the designated holes on the Base. The shadows part and base should be painted before construction.

Note: This kit does not contain #32 and #33.
